- 250 millions of new intrants in the labour market until 2050
- Classic pathway of structural transformation is not operating in Africa: the ability of the agricultural sector to provide quality jobs for all in the future, notably youth and women, is at stake
- But what research explores when talking of work and employment ?
- Definitions:
 - Work: interaction between humans and tasks
 - Employment: status, income, social protection
- A Systematic Review of Literature to clarify major topics, disciplines and contributive countries (authors, studies)


