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Enhancement of Employment and Income Opportunities for Rural Youth in Ethiopia: A Review of Four Large Youth Employment Initiatives



The youth in Ethiopia are estimated to constitute 30% of the population. Around 81% of them lived in rural areas, and 98% of the rural youth depended on the agriculture sector in 2016. Through generations, most of the youth in rural Ethiopia have been sharing the same land with their parents and other adults. As a result, the land size available to youth is becoming increasingly insufficient. Moreover, the youth are the hardest hit by poverty, the highest unemployed groups of the society, and the number of youth job seekers is increasing overtime. For instance, 1.52 million job seekers were registered in rural areas in eight regions in late 2018. Employment opportunities have been very limited in rural Ethiopia because of lack of complementary investments and poor access to finance and land. These unfavorable conditions have been contributing to the unabating rural-urban migration and migration abroad. In a bid to ameliorate rural unemployment and underemployment problems, the Ethiopian government recently started developing youth employment initiatives, packages and policies. This paper aims to document four of the major interventions, particularly for rural youth. Below are summaries of the main interventions since 2000.

But because consumers recently have changed the way they buy and consume food, various snags in the food supply chain have led to disruptions, including truckloads of raspberries getting turned back from market and dairy businesses dumping thousands of gallons of milk.

'Pesticides are our children now': cultural change and the technological treadmill in the Burkina Faso cotton sector

Amidst broad debates about the “New Green Revolution” in Africa, input-intensive agriculture is on the rise in some parts of Africa. This paper examines the underlying drivers of the recent and rapid adoption of herbicides and genetically modified seeds in the Burkina Faso cotton sector. Drawing on 8 months of ethnographic fieldwork in the Houndé region, this article contends that economic and cultural dynamics—often considered separately in analyses of technology adoption—have co-produced a self-reinforcing technological treadmill. On the one hand, male farmers seek to increase cotton production in response to an economic squeeze. At the same time, broader cultural shifts toward individualism have created labor shortages as a result of families splitting apart, parents putting their children in school, and some women and young men refusing to provide free labor. Male cotton farmers thus increase production by turning to labor-saving inputs like herbicides, but these inputs create more debt, further locking farmers into intensive production. This article thus expands on the classic concept of the technological treadmill, demonstrating how economic and cultural processes intersect within a process of agrarian change to drive labor-saving agricultural technology adoption in the Burkinabè cotton sector. This expanded treadmill concept illuminates the complex dynamics compelling farmers’ choices to opt into input-intensive agriculture, and also helps explain rising farmer differentiation, as poorer farmers struggle to stay afloat and wealthier farmers expand.

[Covid 19] Gérer la conduite de finition des femelles allaitantes pour en programmer les sorties

En cette période inédite de crise sanitaire, les producteurs de viande bovine peuvent être amenés à devoir retarder la vente de leurs vaches de réformes ou de leurs génisses finies. Ce report doit être géré en maîtrisant les coûts, sans dégrader la qualité des carcasses (poids de vente dans les objectifs et état d'engraissement optimal). Il est bien évidemment nécessaire de se rapprocher de ses interlocuteurs habituels (commerciaux de Coop ou d'OP, acheteurs,...) pour anticiper le plus possible les sorties prévisionnelles et ainsi adapter la stratégie de finition des animaux. Le pré-requis est de bien piloter la note d'état corporel (NEC) des animaux.

Brasil, agricultura familiar representa 77% dos empregos agrícolas

Relatório lançado na quinta-feira (26) afirmou que a agricultura familiar é uma das principais atividades geradoras de novas fontes de trabalho na América Latina e Caribe. Na América do Sul, a participação da atividade nos empregos agrícolas é significativa, oscilando nos países analisados entre 53% (Argentina) e 77% (Brasil).



Os dados são do resumo executivo do relatório “Perspectivas da Agricultura e do Desenvolvimento Rural nas Américas 2014: uma visão para a América Latina e Caribe [2]”. O documento foi lançado durante o Encontro de Ministros da Agricultura das Américas em Buenos Aires, Argentina, e produzido pela Comissão Econômica para a América Latina e o Caribe (CEPAL), pela Organização das Nações Unidas para Alimentação e Agricultura (FAO) e pelo Instituto Interamericano de Cooperação para a Agricultura (IICA).

Na América Central, a agricultura familiar representa mais de 50% dos empregos no setor agrícola em todos os países, com exceção da Costa Rica (36%). No Panamá representa 71% e em Honduras 77%.

How COVID-19 is throttling vital global migration flows

According to one estimate, migrants contribute nearly 10% of global GDP. Now, everyone from a migrant agricultural worker relying on a paycheck in Portugal to a foreign healthcare worker living in Sweden is potentially impacted by a dramatic tightening of borders. Some countries, like Australia, have barred entry to anyone who isn't a citizen or resident. Others, like the US, have suspended the entry of people from certain places. Some countries have made exemptions for "essential" workers - for Canada, that includes caregivers and seafood processors.

German farms need nearly 300,000 seasonal workers



There is no shortage of food during the coronavirus pandemic, but farmers are urgently looking for seasonal workers for the harvest. The German government wants to help by relaxing employment rules and providing online placement. EURACTIV Germany reports.

Under time pressure, the German Government is looking for ways to mobilise sufficient seasonal workers for the harvest. On Monday (23 March), Chancellor Angela Merkel's cabinet agreed to significantly loosen labour laws for harvest workers.

The ministers decided to extend the "70-day rule." With these changes, seasonal workers may now work for up to 115 days in short-term employment until the end of October without paying social security contributions. The additional income limits for short-time work compensation and for farmers' pensions were also raised.

Coronavirus Covid 19 farm business update 12 Mar 2020

Dairy Australia aims to ensure farmers, their families, staff and communities are safe and well as the situation around COVID-19 evolves. The dairy industry has a dedicated group which is actively monitoring the situation and meeting regularly to manage the impact for dairy farmers and the wider industry.

How can I manage the impact of COVID-19 on my farm business?

Dairy farmers have a number of options to prepare their business and make contingency plans.

Farmers can consider:

- Protecting your staff from exposure - consider international visitors, people returning from overseas from at risk areas, and

consider self-isolation if staff unwell.

- Potential impacts on your business and ability to operate.
- Operating with limited labour due to staff having to self-isolate following travel or closure of schools or childcare
- What goods (e.g. chemicals) do you rely on to keep your business going in the coming three to four months.

Contact suppliers to secure goods or source alternatives.

- At this point the World Organisation for Animal Health and the Australian Veterinary Association indicated there is

no evidence that livestock can contract or spread the disease.

Livestock route mapping for improved health of humans, animals and the environment

Pastoralism is an effective and productive livelihood system that makes the best use of variably distributed natural resources in often dry rangeland areas where it has a particularly strong comparative advantage over other land uses. In order to function well, pastoralists and their livestock need to move across the rangeland landscape to access grazing, browse, water and minerals as well as services such as markets. New Release: Enhancing Youth Employment Opportunities in Rural Economies in Ethiopia

This report aims to examine the youth employment conditions in rural Ethiopia and to assess the performance of the rural youth employment creation initiatives. The reports also address untapped youth employment opportunities and the reasons as to why they remain untapped in rural areas. We conducted key informant interviews and collected primary data from 626 respondents living in rural areas of the two most populous regions in Ethiopia. Two-third of the respondents were beneficiaries of government youth employment initiates while the rest of them were the youth registered as unemployed. The beneficiaries were primarily selected from the Youth Revolving Fund program, a government youth employment creation initiative that provides fund and capacity building training's for the youth to create self-employed jobs.

Food supply worries farmers in US as coronavirus disrupts their work

April and May are critical planting and harvesting times for many US farmers. They need skilled laborers to work their fields, and a reliable supply chain to deliver their goods. And they don't have any time to waste.

If farmers can't find enough workers or if their farming practices are disrupted because of the pandemic, Americans could have less or pricier food this summer. And because international farmers and their supply chains face similar problems, we could receive fewer food imports, potentially limiting supply and driving up prices.

The Effects of COVID-19 Will Ripple through Food Systems -

The situation is to be expected in a pandemic, Martin says, citing a 2006 World Bank report that outlines how efforts to contain such outbreaks—including restaurant closures and disruptions to public transportation and tourism—tend to take a larger toll on the global economy than the hours of work lost from people falling ill. The report estimated that a modern pandemic similar to the 1918 Spanish flu would result in a 0.9 percent loss in GDP because of sick workers, compared with a 1.9 percent loss linked to policies enforced to control infection. Farmers of high-value crops get hit especially hard by those policies, Martin says.

One example comes from apple orchards, which require large crews to plant and prune trees. Pruning helps eliminate diseased branches and gives foliage more access to sunlight. But many apple growers rely on seasonal workers from outside of the country for these tasks, and many of these workers are struggling to get visas processed because of embassy and federal office closures. Without an adequate workforce, growers may have to leave trees unplanted and branches unpruned. This neglect could lead to losses later

this season and in future years, says Diane Kurle, senior vice president of the USAApple Association, a nonprofit organization based in Falls Church, Va., that represents growers and others in the industry.

Ag sector may begin seeing coronavirus pandemic effects



Coronavirus is taking a bite out of local businesses on Main Street and now the implications for agriculture are beginning to take shape, said the rural entrepreneurship specialist with University of Wyoming Extension.

Those implications include falling commodity prices affecting any farmer who had March contracts for delivering grain, said Cole Ehmke in the Department of Agricultural and Applied Economics at UW.

“And it seems likely there will be a manpower shortage,” said Ehmke. “Custom harvesters for wheat often draw crews from countries such as Australia and South Africa who may not be able to get here. Labor will likely be an issue for producers of fresh vegetables for farmers markets and horticultural products as the spring develops.”
