COVID-19 and the Agriculture Industry: Labor, Supply Chains, and Consumer Behavior

It's no secret that producers of toilet paper and PPE had a quick increase in demand in March 2020. But how has the global pandemic affected the labor markets, supply chains, and overall consumer behavior specifically in the United States?

In the new theme of articles "COVID-19 and the Agriculture Industry: Labor, Supply Chains, and Consumer Behavior," six articles discuss the effects of COVID-19 on labor disruptions, policy changes, H-2A program, transportation and consumer purchasing behavior.

Peña-Lévano, the theme organizer says, "This COVID-19 pandemic has exposed existing weaknesses in the food supply systems such as services, processing and production, which have affected labor, supply systems and consumer behavior. We hope that readers would improve their understanding about the importance of crop workers, including commercial drivers, and that they are the backbone of the agribusiness industry, and key to supply chain resilience and economic recovery during times of crisis. Likewise, this pandemic has highlighted importance of foreign farm workers sourced through the H-2A program. As the farm sector asserts its position as supplier of essential goods during the pandemic, it will need an adequate supply of workers as reliable as its foreign workers in order to survive and thrive. Finally, the pandemic may induce long-lasting effects in the economy accelerating automation of the supply chain and online shopping as an increasing method of purchasing goods."

To mark the start of Mental Health Awareness Week in New Zealand, the dairy sector is calling for rural mental health to be a priority.

DairyNZ, Federated Farmers and Dairy Women's Network are concerned by the levels of mental health issues in rural communities, as illustrated in 'The View from the Cowshed' report released last month, and want to see action.

DairyNZ's report highlighted that rural mental health is an ongoing issue, with 62 percent of dairy farmers stating they, or someone on their farm, has experienced mental health issues in the past 12 months.

DairyNZ chief executive Dr Tim Mackle says sadly the statistics are not surprising, as mental health has been a recurring issue in rural communities for some time - but that needs to change.

Sheep - Reducing the labour requirement at lambing through breeding

Both ewe mothering ability and lamb vigour can be improved through breeding. In fact all improvements made through breeding are permanent and cumulative being passed on from one generation to the next as Teagasc researchers Áine O'Brien and Donagh Berry and Alan Bohan, Sheep Ireland explain.

Main Messages

- Lambing accounts for over 25% of the labour requirement throughout the year
- Improving ewe mothering ability and lamb vigour immediately after birth could reduce the labour requirement
- Both ewe mothering ability and lamb vigour can be improved through breeding

Migrant Farmworkers at High Risk for Coronavirus

At any one time depending on the season, there are over 1 to 2,4 million farmworkers in the U.S., about half of whom are undocumented. Living in close quarters with scarce personal protection equipment or opportunities for frequent handwashing, migrant farmworkers have an increased risk of contracting the coronavirus. Frequent exposure to pesticides, dust, and exhaust fumes from machinery can also have harmful effects on their immune system. Few have access to healthcare services, and workers are reluctant to stay home when they are sick because they won't get paid. When testing for COVID-19 is provided, many are afraid to participate due to their undocumented status. Farmworkers in the southern states are now migrating to northern regions for the growing season, creating widespread fear that this will further result in the spread of the virus.
