COVID-19 has made life even more precarious for migrant workers

Migrant workers were also targets of discrimination and xenophobia, says the report, Locked down and in limbo: The global impact of COVID-19 on migrant worker rights and recruitment.

Many migrant workers had their employment summarily suspended or terminated as the virus spread, leaving them without a source of income. Some employees were stood down without pay, while others had their hours or rates of pay reduced, or were required to go on leave. Others were not paid for work they had done, in violation of the terms of their contracts.

Structural transformation in the era of global agricultural value chains

Participation in agri-food global value chains (AGVCs) has been at the centre of much recent development policy debate in low-income countries, especially in sub-Saharan Africa and South Asia, where the agriculture sector is the main source of livelihoods, accounting for more than 15% of GDP (World Bank 2019, Zimmermann et al. 2020, Zhan et al. 2020, Antimiani and Cernat 2021, Pasquali et al. 2021). But

few studies have explored how participation in AGVCs influences the national economic outcomes of modern agrarian economies. This column summarises my 2021 investigation of how globalised agri-food value chains affect structural transformation (Lim 2021).

Loss of communal grazing lands in India threatens the status of pastoralist women



These socio-economic changes are part of a broader deterioration of pastoralist women's status in India. Pastoralist women have tremendous indigenous knowledge of livestock keeping, which traditionally allowed them to share responsibilities with men by managing the commons and participating in decision-making processes. However, women do not possess the same wealth of knowledge about crop farming, so as grasslands continue to be ploughed over to make room for crops, pastoralist women are losing their land management and decision-making responsibilities. Many pastoralist women also report that without regular migrations, they are losing their connection to nature and their culture, resulting in a poorly defined self-identity and a loss of self-worth.

Meat 'sticker shock' looms as US\$3,000 bonuses fail to end worker shortfall

Before COVID, meat processors struggled to meet their labor needs, which increased the hiring of immigrant workers mostly from Mexico. More than a third of the workforce was foreign born, according to a 2020 report by the Economic Policy Institute. That hurt the industry when the Trump administration curtailed immigration.

The pandemic only exacerbated the hiring woes, while raising new concerns about how meatpackers will recruit in the long term. The industry expected the labor shortage to get easier after extra unemployment benefits in the COVID relief ended in September, but it hasn't. Across the overall job market, the number of people quitting is surging and job openings remain near all-time highs. Online postings for meat processing positions are up 66 per cent from a year ago, according to Emsi Burning Glass, an analytics firm.
