Why health truly is wealth for farmers

Farmers need to make sleep, a healthy diet and exercise a priority, according to a new study by DCU which reports that half of Irish farmers have problems sleeping and close to a quarter have experienced burnout. Farmers require energy and vibrancy to thrive. Being tired or 'below par' leads to poor decision-making and work becoming a grind. A recent study of Irish farmers, conducted by Dublin City University, found that almost one in four (24%) reported burnout and half (50%) had sleep issues.
