Chemical, ecological, other? Identifying weed management typologies within industrialized cropping systems in Georgia (U.S.)

Abstract Since the introduction and widespread adoption of chemical herbicides, "weed management" has become almost synonymous with "herbicide management." Over-reliance on herbicides and herbicide-resistant crops has given rise to herbicide resistant weeds.
